OSS: Business Capable

- Robust: Yes, Linux and xBSD are mature
 - MS Windows Server 2003 is new challenge
 - As a Desktop becoming mature
- Applications: Good enough
- Interoperability: Good enough
- Portability: Good enough



Current Situation: MS Windows

- Easy Initial Configuration (Installation)
 - MS Windows Server 2003 is new benchmark
 - DNS, DHCP: Auto-configure
 - File and Print: Just works
 - Web Serving: Just works
 - Messaging / E-mail: Just works
 - SQL Server: Just works
- Safe solution from license perspective
- Dominant Desktop benchmark

Current Situation: Linux

- Fast / Easy Installation
- Desktop Maturing Rapidly
- Server:
 - Mature
 - Recent survey shows 37% of sites run Linux
 - Fast and easy to install
 - Configuration of Services is key liability
 - DNS, DHCP, Samba, Apache, SQUID, etc.

OSS: Coming Soon

- Samba-3.0.0
 - Better Integration into MS Windows networks
 - Migration facility for move from NT4 to Samba
 - Native Active Directory membership
 - Better Documentation
 - HOWTO
 - Samba-2.2.x Version was 88 pages (Unix Oriented)
 - Now 540 pages (MS Windows Oriented)
 - Challenge is configuration / management
 - SWAT is highly criticized needs replacement

Big Demand For

- Microsoft Active Directory
 - Use of Kerberos / LDAP mechano set partial solution is an incomplete alternative
- Microsoft Exchange Server
 - OSS Calendering support is NOT available
- Better Configuration Tools
 - Must integrate with Microsoft Management Console <u>OR</u> alternative OSS tool that can manage MS Windows clients / servers

Key Obstacle

- A profitable business model
 - OSS has reputation of FREE
 - Software is FREE so support should be FREE!
 - No one has had focus on building a channel
 - Needed for support
 - Cost effective way to reach customers / end users
- Need a compelling way to attract investment
 - Where is the money?
